

2018–2019 In-School Suspension (ISS) for BHS, FMS, FCHS, HUB

PARENTS:

ISS programs for Berry High School, Fayette Middle School, Fayette County High School, and Hubbertville School students will be held at their respective campuses.

Placements may vary from 1-5 days. If your child is assigned to ISS three times, you will be notified. You will also be notified if your child is assigned more than 5 days (long-term).

Your child will be grouped with same-aged peers and supervised by a board employee. They may receive breakfast and will be served lunch in the ISS classroom. Please make sure that your child does not bring an electronic device to ISS. If they bring an electronic device, it will be taken up. You may pick them up at the school one week later. The school phone is available in emergency situations.

Please talk to your child about the importance of following school rules in order to avoid ISS placement(s).

Possible infractions that will result in ISS placement:

- *fighting
- *tobacco use
- *use of electronic devices
- *failure to do homework
- *3 discipline referrals – pink slips
- *consistent violation of dress code
- *excessive tardies
- *other violations of the *Code of Student Conduct*.....as determined by administrators

A copy of these rules will be available at the local school with ISS programs, posted on the school website, and posted on the county website.

These rules will be read to students upon arrival in ISS:

1. No electronic devices
2. No gum or candy or snacks
3. No talking without permission
4. No tobacco products
5. No sleeping
6. Must participate in physical activity/recess
7. Must complete all assigned work

Student will be supervised by a board employee at all times. Students will be provided breakfast and lunch in the ISS classroom. Bathroom breaks will be provided.

If rules are not followed, another day of ISS may be assigned or the student may be suspended.
