

Observation Protocol

- **All non-tenured teachers and teachers on a full evaluation cycle will receive a minimum of two 30 minute observations per year (1 Fall Semester & 1 Spring Semester).**
- **Observations will be semi-announced (Teacher will be given a general time in which an observation may take place (“I may visit next week” or “Is there a day in the near future that would be bad for an observation”).**
- **Observations will typically be conducted by building administrators. Central office personnel may also conduct observations when needed.**
- **Feedback from observations will be provided within five days.**
- **Teachers not on full evaluation cycle will be monitored through instructional walkthroughs.**
- **Instructional walkthroughs may be conducted at any time and can be announced or unannounced.**
- **The ELEOT Observation Tool will be used for observations.**

Self-Assessment / Professional Learning Plan

- **Every teacher in Fayette County Schools will complete an annual self-assessment in Google Classroom.**
- **Every teacher will then develop his/her annual Professional Learning Plan in Google Classroom based on the results from the self-assessment.**
- **A school administrator will collaborate with the teacher to assist in the development of the PLP.**
- **The self-assessment should be completed on or before August 20th of each year.**
- **The Professional Learning Plan should be completed on or before September 15th of each year.**
- **Evidence should be entered periodically to the Professional Learning Plan.**
- **At least 2 pieces of evidence should be entered before December 19th.**
- **At least 4 total pieces of evidence should be entered before May 1st.**
- **ALL documentation will be kept the EET Google Classroom.**
